SUCCESS STORY – LADSAF for ladders over 6m



WHAT WAS THE PROBLEM?

The HSERs at KGP had identified ladders over 6m non-compliant to industry standards and carry a risk of injury due to fall from heights. An MOC was created, and KGP purchased a propriety 'Lad Saf' system install in selected locations to trail and determine if these systems should be used in other locations.

The Monos Rope Access Team were tasked with installation.



WHAT DID WE DO TO FIX IT?

Having installed the initial Ladsaf system on the furnace ladder, the crew identified safety concerns to personnel whilst attaching and detaching to the Ladsaf system at height.

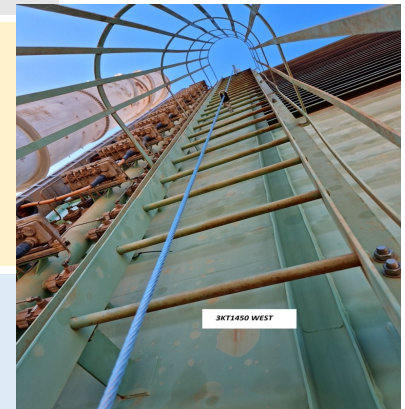
The product was not fit for purpose in areas where you could access platforms from the left and the right, this was due to the location of the wire having to be central to attach/detach resulting in personal having to lean into the void. Additionally, ladders fitted with gates instead of chains required personnel to be exposed to an open edge to access the fall arrest system.



WHAT DID WE ACHIEVE?

The team raised concerns with the Supervisor, with support from Mngt and HSE the task was stopped. At the monthly WEL HSER meeting, the MEA HSERs raised the concerns with some of the locations the system was being installed. The task was temporarily ceased while alternate engineering solutions were sort for those locations identified as unfit for purpose.

The team were then actively involved in locating ladders >6m where the ladsaf system was applicable ie maintenance on pulse air hoses where access to platforms no required.



WHO DID IT?

Great work by the Monos campaign rope access team, Management, HSE team and the HSER reps. A perfect example of being able to stop a job, speak up and raise safety concerns knowing you have the support of Monadelphous and the Client.

SUCCESS STORY – HSER Action Tracker



WHAT WAS THE PROBLEM?

Making sure all items raised at safety meetings, and issues raised to HSERs are captured and actioned



WHAT DID WE DO TO FIX IT?

Formulated an HSER Action Tracker. This captures all items, big or small, and puts the onus on leadership to provide responses, and in turn, actions. This Action Tracker is delivered to the entire workforce at the 3 weekly safety meetings, alongside the site Top 10 list.



WHAT DID WE ACHIEVE?

Consistent channels of communication. Items remain in the Action Tracker until response/closed out. More visibility of HSERs.
